The center that he championed is equipped to house up to 75 clients, and the new center has ample space for vocational training such as sewing, classrooms for English and computer study, counseling rooms, a clinic, meeting rooms and more. Because of support from David and Lali Wager, SeedOne, and all of the many churches and partners over these last few years, the Women's Program now has a place to flourish. In January, we were honored to dedicate the center in memory of our dear friend David Wager for his passion and service.



Teen Challenge Cambodia long had a dream of building a permanent home for the Women's Program, and with huge thanks to David and Lali Wagner and SeedOne, this dream has become a reality. The journey was a long and difficult one, but we have seen God's guiding hand throughout the process. After renting a center for many years, we purchased land for a new center on May 5, 2014. Next, we added 920 truckloads of dirt to raise the level of the land, and we built a fence around the property in 2015. Building happened in stages until the

building was completed on August 5, 2017.

Throughout this process, David Wagner from SeedOne visited more than 10 times. He connected us to a network of churches in the United States who not only contributed financially but also sent teams to labor under the hot Cambodian sun. They served sacrificially laying tiles, painting, installing the electrical system and more. Through it all, David was our champion and our encourager. Then, shortly after seeing the completed project, David passed

"The number one thing that I have gained from the women's center is that I have the opportunity to know God. The center has also helped me become clean from drugs. As the only daughter of a business-woman and a customs official, Leap's early life was quite comfortable. However, her mom's cancer diagnosis would set in motion a series of changes that ended with Leap living on the street.

Her mom would eventually die of cancer, and her father abandoned her. She left to live with relatives

and married young, but Leap ran away after a family dispute. She found work in a beer garden, a dangerous place where Leap became addicted to drugs and alcohol. There, she met another man and had four children with him. However, he too was addicted to drugs and alcohol, and he was eventually arrested for theft and sentenced to two years in prison.

During this time, Leap was living on the street with her four children, and one of our Christian partner organizations referred her to Teen Challenge. She completed our one-year program and attending discipleship classes and vocational training. Leap has now started a new life and is working as a seamstress.
